Caesalpinia gilliesii



Caesalpinia pulcherrima has been **commonly used to treat minor injuries or to relieve fever**, and scientific studies have indicated that it does have properties that allow it to work as an anti-inflammatory. Studies have also indicated that this plant may be effective in assisting with weight loss.

MEDICINAL USE:

Helps in cases of cholera.

For abortion

To prevent recurrence of diseases, like malaria.

Promotes menstrual flow.

As a purgative or the watery evacuation of the bowels.

For producing energy.

To relieve chest affections.

To reduce or eliminate fever.

Widely used for the cure of bronchitis, asthma and for malarial fevers.

HOW TO USE:

The decoction of the roots is given for cholera.

The infusion of the leaves or the bark is used for abortion.

The infusion of the leaves is used to prevent recurrence like malaria, promote menstrual flow, work as a purgative, and for producing energy.

The infusion of the flowers is used to relieve chest affections, reduce or eliminate fever, cure bronchitis, asthma and malarial fevers.



PARTS USED:

Root, bark, leaves and flowers.
