Blue Chalk Sticks Kleinia mandraliscae



A native of South Africa, blue chalk succulents are often a favorite of succulent growers. Senecio talinoides subs. mandraliscae, also called blue chalk sticks, is possibly a hybrid and was found in Italy. The South African native is called blue chalk succulent or blue fingers for its attractive bluish, finger-like leaves. It also produces white summer blooms.

Native to South Africa, the succulent known by the name blue fingers, Blue Chalk Sticks, or Senecio Serpens, is often a favorite amongst succulent lovers. Senecio talinoides subs. Mandraliscae is thought to be a hybrid species of Blue Chalk Sticks and was found in Italy. Having powdery blue, almost alienlooking, finger-like leaves, this gorgeous succulent also produces stunning white summer flowers.
