Cubanola Cubanola domingensis Portlandia domingensis



The Cubanola is a small, tropical tree native to the Dominican Republic, Cuba and other parts of the Caribbean. It grows 5-8' tall in full sun or shade. In our conservatory, the white, trumpet-shaped blooms cover this tree a couple times a year for over a month. The blooms are fragrant at night and in the morning.

The large 8" long, white to greenish white, dangling angel's trumpet-like, night fragrant flowers are produced over an extended period a few times a year and the plants begin flowering at a very young age. Cubanola or Campanita, Portlandia domingensis, is a naturally evergreen small tree-like tropical shrub with glossy rich green foliage growing to about 5-8' high. It is shade tolerant but is reported to flower the most profusely where it gets more sun. The night fragrant flowers attract a variety of pollinating moths and makes a neat addition to a moon moth garden either as a container plant or in the ground where reliably hardy. Provide an average moist well-drained soil for optimum growth and flowering.



Cubanola or Campanita Criolla is native to the Carribean and is found in alkaline soils as an understory plant. Mature plants become more rounded with age developing into a beautiful container specimen. It is naturally evergreen but may drop foliage and flowers where temperatures fall below about 45oF. Moderately slow rate of growth.
