Known Hazards: The seeds are poisonous.

Common Name: African Mahogany

Habitats: Humid and dry forests, tree savanna.

African Mahogany has medicinal purposes and is used in traditional medicine as **laxative, analgesic, antihemorrhagic, febrifuge, aphrodisiac, emmenagogue, and emetic**. It is also used in local medicine for treating digestive problems and for general pain relief. Its bark is used as a fish poison.

Khaya senegalensis is highly reputed for its numerous medicinal uses in Nigeria. It is used traditionally as antisickling, antimicrobial, anthelmintic, and for treatment of malaria. Its stem bark and leaves have been reported to be effective against Plasmodium falciparum in in vitro studies].

What is the common name of Khaya senegalensis?

dry zone mahogany

Khaya senegalensis is a species of tree in the Meliaceae family that is native to Africa. Common names include African mahogany, dry zone mahogany, Gambia mahogany, khaya wood, Senegal mahogany, cailcedrat, acajou, djalla, and bois rouge.



What is the use of paullinia pinnata?

Paullinia pinnata Linn leaf, root and bark extracts are widely used in African folk medicine to treat several diseases including rheumatism, weakness, impotence, ulcers, haemorrhoids, wounds, malaria, fever, hypertension, contraceptive, syphilis, convulsion, typhoid, and diarrhea.

How do you plant Khaya Senegalensis?

Khaya senegalensis They should be planted into the field early in the wet season after sufficient rain has fallen. Another method of planting stock is to use striplings or wildlings. These are small seedlings about 40 to 50 cm in height and about the thickness of a pencil, growing at the base of large mature trees .
